#### **Guest Editorial**

As the summer of 2022 fades, there is increasing anxiety about what winter will bring, and about the impact of the cost of living rises, though this summer will surely be remembered for heat and drought, like the summer of 1976, when the fields across the UK turned yellow, the water levels in rivers and reservoirs dropped and temperatures rose to previously unrecorded highs. What we have been experiencing in Britain in 2022 has been reflected across Europe, where even great rivers like the Rhine and the Po in Northern Italy fell to dangerously low levels. I was staying with my eldest daughter in London during the July heatwave and the temperature rose to 40 degrees down there on the hottest day. It wasn't particularly pleasant, but we coped with it and took precautions - the dogs were walked before 8.00am, we drank lots of cups of tea and water throughout the day, we closed all the windows because the air inside the house was cooler than outside and we wore light, loose-fitting clothes. By the evening as things cooled down, there was even on some days a bit of a breeze.

My childhood was spent in Southern Europe, so hot weather was an everyday occurrence during the summer months. I remember that we did not have a fridge for many years, and a cart would bring round great blocks of ice that were put in the ice cupboard, a wooden box with a metal grill across the door to keep out the flies. We were always made to drink a lot, and every day my mother used to give us a small glass of water with a spoonful of salt dissolved in it, which tasted disgusting but which was supposed to replace whatever we lost through sweating.

Extreme heat, like extreme cold is unpleasant, but millions of people across the world cope with both those conditions in their everyday lives. Of course, very hot weather in a city is not the same as hot weather beside the sea, though thankfully in Britain there are a lot of parks and places where you can walk in the shade. But what has surprised me this summer has been the deluge of infantile warnings combined with sensational headlines. Each time I opened my iPad or a newspaper or turned on the radio I was given all kinds of pretty obvious advice - wear a hat in the sun, keep drinking fluids, use sun cream, stay indoors unless you have to go out... and headline after headline suggesting almost that the apocalypse was nigh and that we were all in danger of dying of heatstroke.

What I didn't find nearly so much of was serious discussion about the implications of the unusually hot summers, the increasingly heavy rains that cause flooding in so many parts of the country and the general sense which we all have that our climate is changing. Yet surely this is what we need to be concerned about, and sensationalist headlines distract from the bigger issue, which is how we can prepare ourselves for a future of more extreme weather conditions.

Across the world, countries have not exactly been world-leading in dealing with climate change. We see images of melting glaciers, rising sea levels, parched agricultural landscapes and somehow, we don't seem to make the connection in our daily lives until something like a heatwave or a flood happens. My son-in-law who is a geography teacher told me that his pupils seemed to have a kind of disconnect between what is happening to the weather and their everyday lives. He asked how many of them keep the tap running when they clean their teeth and every hand went up, while they all seem to think that having a ten-minute shower is perfectly normal.

Politicians of all parties have been hopeless at helping people to make such connections, and the sensationalist media that fuels fear doesn't help one bit. Surely what we need is a measured public health campaign, with sensible practical advice about saving water in a heatwave and saving energy in winter. We do not need to be talked down to as though we were ninnies, but neither do we need to be frightened by dismal speculations. I hope that as the autumn advances we will see less of public figures telling us to put on an extra jumper or buy a new kettle, fewer wild attention-grabbing headlines and witness some sensible, discussion of how we can help ourselves and help the planet too.

# Former Pupil to Lead Dales Dance School

Veteran dance teacher Janet Seymour has passed the running of her much-loved Dales dance school to former pupil and qualified dance teacher, Hannah Smith. The Janet Seymour School of Theatre Dance will now be called the Dales Dance School of Performing Arts.

Janet Seymour began teaching dance in the Dales in 2004 to six children from Reeth as a volunteer. She has since built a thriving school offering ballet, tap, modern and jazz dance lessons at ten different venues in Swaledale and Wensleydale. More than two-hundred girls and boys aged from three to eighteen are currently on the school roll.

Hannah Smith learnt ballet, tap and modern with Janet till she was eighteen. After training in London, Hannah taught dance and musical theatre at Victoria Walker School in Ireland. In 2020 she returned to her home in the Dales to work with Janet as an assistant teacher, meaning that she knows many of her pupils already.

Hannah said: "Janet must have taught over one-thousand children in the Dales, and I was lucky enough to be one of them. My first dance lesson with Janet was a tap class. She said to me "can you do a shuffle hop step", and I could, so I was put in a slightly higher class. Thanks to Janet, I spent my youth dancing, performing, and living and breathing the arts, despite living in a deeply rural area. I don't have to think about smiling when I perform — that is my emotion. I'm so thrilled to be taking on the dance school and sharing that love with others."

Janet said: "It makes me so happy to know I am handing my school over to my former pupil and very talented colleague, Hannah. I know the school will go from strength to strength. Hannah has already won the students over with her caring nature. From our youngest to our more mature students, Hannah motivates and encourages with her warm, creative classes."

Although the leadership role will lie with Hannah, Janet has no plans to retire and will continue to teach classes under the school's new name. "We are a team," says Hannah, "we are swapping places, but it's wonderful to have the continuity."

The passing of the baton was celebrated at a picnic event in the picturesque grounds of

Askrigg School in July, where an audience of one-hundred and fifty gathered to watch a performance of The Wizard of Oz and a showcase of dance sequences from pupils across Wensleydale and Swaledale.



As well as offering weekly lessons and opportunities to progress through the exam system with the Royal Academy of Dance, Janet Seymour has put children on the stage at venues such as the Georgian Theatre Royal in Richmond and Tennants in Leyburn, organised concerts at local festivals and care homes, arranged international dance-based exchanges between the Dales and Germany, taught summer schools, choregraphed pantomimes and run inspirational classes for adults.

Janet said: "The dance school actually grew during lockdown. Hannah and I started teaching on Zoom at 8.00am and were still going twelve hours later. For some pupils the lessons were the only normality they had. Dance gives you joy and love for the arts, but it also gives you coping strategies. It helps mental health and gets you through the difficult times in life. It enables you to enter into a world of fantasy and imagination."

The Dales Dance School of Performing Art launched on September 12th. It will provide expert dance tuition across Swaledale and Wensleydale to children from three years and adults, and specialise in teaching RAD Ballet, ISTD Tap and Jazz, Musical Theatre and Jazz Fit. 

# Bainbridge WI -Keeping Busy In Autumn

So, September turned out to be an interesting month, but perhaps not for the reasons we were expecting. With the death of HM Queen Elizabeth II, we started our September meeting with a minute's silence to remember the woman who was not only our Queen, but also a member of the WI. She will be missed - rest in peace Your Majesty.

At that meeting, we had a really interesting talk by a volunteer from the Wharfedale Fell Rescue. We learned that the organisation is run entirely by volunteers and there is no charge made for their rescue services. However, the annual running costs are currently around £50,000, and likely to rise in the next year due to inflation. There are currently sixty members who are on call 24/7, 365 days a year to rescue those who get into trouble on the hills, fells and caves across an area from Wensleydale to Skipton, Keighley and Malham.

The group has been in existence since 1948 when they initially operated from an old railway carriage in Grassington. They now have purpose -built premises in Grassington along with rescue vehicles, including Land Rovers and a Forward Control Unit, fully equipped with computers, heating and a 15m radio mast. We were somewhat stunned to hear that when they need to call in helicopter assistance, this is now provided by Bristows from North Lincolnshire who are required to work under Civil Aviation regulations (those that apply when we travel by air), meaning that no sharp objects or liquids can be carried - somewhat daft given that they are trying to save lives!

We learned that it is a pre-requisite that volunteers get wet as they are generally called out in bad weather, or to underground incidents



where it is usually wet! Indeed, following the increase in flooding, they have now launched a Swift Water Team, specifically trained to undertake rescues from flood water. The service also uses search dogs who undergo intense training with the National Association of Rescue Dogs, and are often used for night rescues when they will seek out anyone sitting or lying on the ground. To call out the service you must first dial 999 and ask for the Police. It is they who then make contact with the Fell Rescue team.

September has also seen members visit Andrew Thwaite at York Cookery School where they enjoyed a cookery and chocolate making demonstration, not to mention a delicious afternoon tea before coming home with 'goody bags' of chocolate! Members have also enjoyed a day of card making, hosted by Diana, and the Lunch Club ladies are to enjoy a visit to The Saddle Room as this newsletter goes to print.

October sees us keeping busy with a felting workshop on **Saturday**, **15th** when we hope to learn how to make a felted brooch. Members are also going along to an event organised by the High Dales Group of WIs on **Thursday**, **6th** when a delicious lunch will be followed by a flower arranging demonstration given by Shannon McIntyre of 'Feather & Fern' in Hawes. Our October meeting on **Thursday 20th** will see the Community Fire Officer coming along to talk to us about how to make our homes safe from fire which could be very useful. Do join us.

The September Community Lunch Hub was cancelled as a mark of respect to the late Queen, but the next one will take place on **Monday, October 24th** at Bainbridge Village Hall when there will be a talk by a lady from 'Carers Plus'. Everyone is welcome to join us around **noon**.

We are always hoping to welcome guests to our monthly meetings and maybe attract some new members to join our merry throng. If you are interested, do come along to one of our meetings which all take place at Bainbridge Village Hall on the third **Thursday of the month, starting at 7.30pm**. We enjoy a speaker or activity, followed by refreshments and the opportunity to chat, and are generally finished by around 9.30pm. Come and give it a go - you will be made very welcome!



# **Police Report**

Incidents of note over the last Month.



### **Prunings**

The heather this year didn't quite make it for the "glorious 12th" but it was wonderful a few days later. I went to my favourite place to view it when the sun was quite high in the afternoon. For me the ideal spot is on the road over from West Witton to Melmerby just after it drops down from the summit. From there the view westward up as far as Great Whernside is spectacular and the heather on the lower slopes of Penhill forms an undulating blanket, while across the valley, Witton Fell is clothed in purple. It is a view not to be missed.

The climbing roses are in need of serious attention. My favourite; "Compassion" has been a joy, but recently it produced a cluster of gorgeous blooms towards the top on the bedroom window, - not ideal. We should not have let it shoot so far, and it will certainly not get chance next year, along with its equally leggy neighbours.

There is some controversy in the air about the banning of peat-based products, particularly compost by 2024. More information in Garden News September 10th issue. The public are apparently in favour of the ban, but the Horticultural Trades Association is concerned that there is not enough time for compost manufacturers to find available and consistent supplies of raw materials for new products and that there will not have been sufficient trialling and testing. We as gardeners have been aware that this was coming for a long time. What on earth have the manufacturers been playing at in the meanwhile? We can all make our own compost at virtually no cost. In addition, I am pleased to report that at least 2 outlets in Leyburn had peat free compost this summer, and if you really want to be eco-friendly, pay a visit to the Leyburn Recycling Centre. They usually have their own compost on sale, it's made from local recycled green waste, contains no peat and doesn't have to travel many miles.

In the late summer sunshine the Rudbeckia



Goldsturm has been a picture. I welcome it every year as it is brilliantly cheerful and flowers for so long. Dahlias have also put on a lovely show and especially impressive are the single flowered types. I have 2 "Bishops", Lincoln and Oxford, which have survived outside from last year. Bees and beasties have a much better chance of feeding from single flowered types.

In this strange year the Aralia has flowered profusely. Most years it struggles to produce flowers before the leaves are turning. It must have been the heat level that changed its behaviour and I wonder if it will set seed. Who knows?

One of the apple trees has produced an enormous crop. I am sometimes asked how you know they are ready. Well, when they start falling off, they are definitely ready, but before that happens test them. Hold the apple firmly and give it a little twist. If it comes away easily, they are ready. If you have to pull hard leave them a bit longer.

Whatever you grow, take time to enjoy it!

#### **Heavens Above**

There's an eclipse of the Sun this month on October 25th, but don't get too excited, it's only a partial one, with just 15% of the solar disc obscured by the Moon. From the UK it begins at 10.00am and ends around 12.45pm with maximum eclipse occurring just before 11.00am. The usual word of warning – if you plan to view the eclipse do not look directly at the Sun especially with binoculars or a telescope. You could seriously damage your eye sight if you do. Without access to specialised equipment the only safe way to view the Sun is by projecting its image onto a shaded piece of white card via the eyepiece of a telescope or one side of a set of binoculars.

This month's always a pretty good one for shooting stars starting with the maximum of the Draconids shower on October 7th. It's not a very prolific display – you might spot 10 or so meteors an hour – but still worth taking a look at. Later on in the month, on the night of October 21st/22nd, the annual Orionid meteor shower reaches its peak. These swift, bright meteors are produced by debris shed by Halley's comet and can reach rates of 15 an hour in a good year. The Moon doesn't rise until 3.30am on the 22nd so it should be a good show provided those clouds don't get in the way.

From the end of October until well on into November, we could be treated to some really spectacular meteors when the Earth passes through a much denser than normal stream of space junk left behind by Encke's comet. With a

On the planetary front, Jupiter is still a brilliant object reasonably high in the south by 11.00pm. Saturn lies well to its right in the south-west. Mars, getting brighter all the time, follows on behind Jupiter rising just after 8.30pm amongst the stars of Taurus the Bull. Venus is lost in the Sun's glare at present but little Mercury, the innermost planet, puts on its best morning show of the year. You'll find it just before dawn low on the eastern horizon from the middle of October onwards.

Finally this month, British Summer Time comes to an end at **2.00am on October 30th** -don't forget to put your clocks back an hour.
